Forty years ago, the CNY Ronald McDonald House was just a dream. But thanks to a dedicated group of local parents who were members of the Children's Special Needs Fund and our founding mission partner, McDonald's, that dream became a reality.

The CNY Ronald McDonald House was built on the simple idea that nothing else should matter when a family is focused on the health of their sick child. Since we first opened our doors on Thanksgiving Day in 1982, thousands have found a temporary home with us, and supporters like you have selflessly given your time, talents and resources to help comfort them when they are going through the unthinkable.

Over the years, our location has changed and our home has grown from seven to 25 bedrooms, but our mission has remained the same. We continue to provide a comforting environment and support system for families from across Central New York, Northern Pennsylvania and even other countries. Our board of directors and team have developed and implemented an Impact Strategy focused on the following goals:

The impact: family-centered care and accommodations

Ronald McDonald House Charities of CNY helps increase access to specialized neonatal and pediatric medical care by providing a nearby place to stay. By staying close at the CNY Ronald McDonald House, parents are able to actively engage with their child's medical team, keep up with complicated treatment plans and focus on what truly matters most: the health and well-being of their child.

We can help reduce stress and alleviate a financial burden by providing vital resources and a family-centered space at **no cost to guest families.** After all, families are stronger when they are together, and by keeping them close, we can play a role in the healing and coping process.



Because of you, each year, we help our families save more than \$500,000 in hotel and meal expenses.

Making families feel at home, even when they can't be.

We believe that "home" is more than just four walls and a roof over your head. That's why we provide guests with all the comforts of home, plus the compassion and hospitality of our staff, volunteers and other families — all just steps away from the hospital.

In addition to the resources we provide, when a family checks in to the CNY Ronald McDonald House — whether in crisis or for a scheduled medical visit — they receive a welcome bag with a variety of items to help make their stay a little more comfortable. Items can include: toiletries, snacks, bottled water, children's books, stuffed animals, baby blankets, knitted caps and more.

Celebrating 40 years of keeping families close

Over the past 40 years, we've grown as an organization, opened a larger, fully accessible home and expanded our services so we could serve even more families in need. Yet after all this time, our mission has remained the same.

Community mission partner spotlight: Twin To Twin Butterfly Fund

Twin To Twin Butterfly Fund is a 501(c)(3) charity that we have been fortunate to partner with in order to help meet the tangible needs of the guest families that stay at the CNY Ronald McDonald House. Founded by the Reiter family, the Twin To Twin Butterfly Fund provides awareness, comfort and support to families impacted by twin-to-twin transfusion syndrome or premature birth. In 2016, identical twins Kora and Kyleigh were born prematurely at 31 weeks due to complications from twin-to-twin transfusion syndrome. While the girls received treatment in the neonatal intensive care unit at Crouse Hospital, the Reiter family stayed with us at the CNY Ronald McDonald House. Today, Kora is a healthy

6-year-old, but sadly, Kyleigh passed away at 42 days of age. The family created Twin To Twin Butterfly Fund in Kyleigh's memory and in the years since has provided invaluable support to our organization.

Over the course of our partnership, the generosity of the fund has been realized through thousands of dollars' worth of individual gift cards and thoughtful projects, like restocking our pantry on a regular basis, that the Reiter family knew would benefit our guest families given their own personal experience.





In-kind donations:

- Preemie gift bags with clothing, burp cloths and blankets
- Laundry packs with laundry detergent and exact change for washers and dryers
- Individual gift cards to local restaurants and hospital cafeterias, for guests to order meals or get them while at the hospital
- Wish list items, including new pots and pans, and many pantry staples
- Thermal lunch bags for guests to use to pack a lunch to bring to the hospital







When guest families stay at the CNY Ronald McDonald House, food is never something we want them to have to worry about. Through our Meals That Heal program, the community helps us provide guest families with much-needed meals and ensure that there is always a hot meal available each night. In addition to the well-balanced meals provided through the program, our kitchen and pantry are fully stocked with breakfast and lunch staples, and guests can prepare their own food or grab on-the-go snacks as they wish.

As we reflect on the past two years, we continue to be grateful for everyone who stepped in to help sponsor meals and for our local restaurant partners that continued their support, even while being affected by ongoing pandemic restrictions themselves.
